#### **Bridges Program** - Serves Northeast Ohio

“Bridges is a voluntary program open to young adults who left foster care in Ohio at ages 18, 19 or 20 and who are in school, working, in an employment program, or have a medical condition that prevents them from going to school or working. The program provides guidance and support as they shift to adulthood.”

Residents learn daily living activities including cooking, cleaning, leisure, and money management as well as social and communication skills. Staff is available onsite to provide support for residents.”
